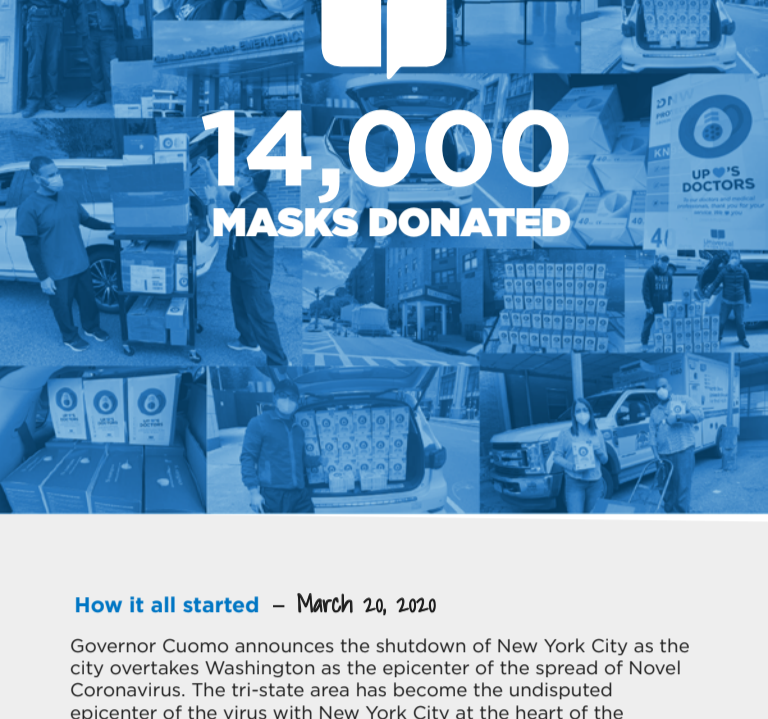




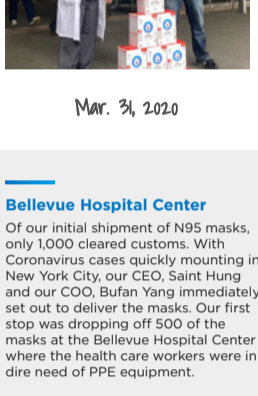

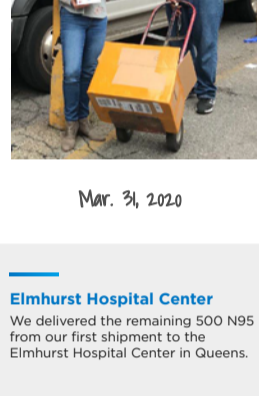
How it all started – March 20, 2020

Governor Cuomo announces the shutdown of New York City as the city overtakes Washington as the epicenter of the spread of Novel Coronavirus. The tri-state area has become the undisputed epicenter of the virus with New York City at the heart of the epidemic. As of April 28th the virus has finally begun to plateau. According to the New York Times, a horrifying 17,638 deaths attributed to Coronavirus have been recorded in New York State, 12,067 of which were concentrated in New York City. Throughout this ordeal there has been a tremendous shortage of PPE, meaning that the city's health care workers have continued to fight on the frontlines against the virus at their own peril. Though the situation seemed bleak, we asked ourselves if there was something we could do to help. So, we scoured our contacts and partners abroad and utilized our international distribution channels in order to secure thousands of N95 masks with the intent to help alleviate the burden on the health care workers fighting for us in our hospitals every day. And that's how the UP'S DOCTORS Program came about.



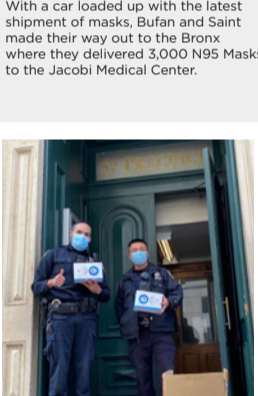
Mar. 31, 2020

Bellevue Hospital Center
Of our initial shipment of N95 masks, only 1,000 cleared customs. With Coronavirus cases quickly mounting in New York City, our CEO, Saint Hung and our COO, Bufan Yang immediately set out to deliver the masks. Our first stop was dropping off 500 of the masks at the Bellevue Hospital Center where the health care workers were in dire need of PPE equipment.



Mar. 31, 2020

Elmhurst Hospital Center
We delivered the remaining 500 N95 from our first shipment to the Elmhurst Hospital Center in Queens.



Apr. 14, 2020

Jacobi Medical Center
With a car loaded up with the latest shipment of masks, Bufan and Saint made their way out to the Bronx where they delivered 3,000 N95 Masks to the Jacobi Medical Center.



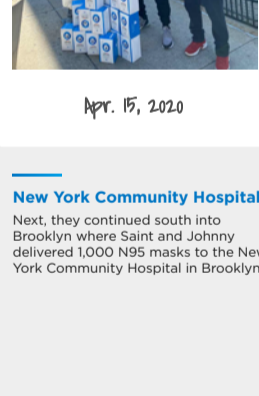
Apr. 13, 2020

12,000 More Masks Arrive
Our masks finally clear customs and arrive safely in New York for distribution.



Apr. 15, 2020

NYPD 5th Precinct
The next day, Saint got a little help delivering the second round of masks from good friend and Universal Processing partner, Johnny Yau. Their first stop was the 5th Precinct in Chinatown where they dropped off 1,000 masks for officers and first responders.



Apr. 15, 2020

Clara Maass Medical Center
The second stop of the day Saint and Bufan across the George Washington Bridge to New Jersey where they dropped off another 2,000 N95 Masks.



May 6, 2020

Local Community Hospitals
As PPE supplies began to catch up at major hospitals in New York we turned our attention towards smaller local community hospitals as well as other private practices and health care providers throughout the country who were set to reopen soon with the opening of the city on May 15th. In the end, we were able to deliver thousands of masks to various private practices in the city and mail out even more to ensure that these small businesses could open safely and help serve their respective communities.

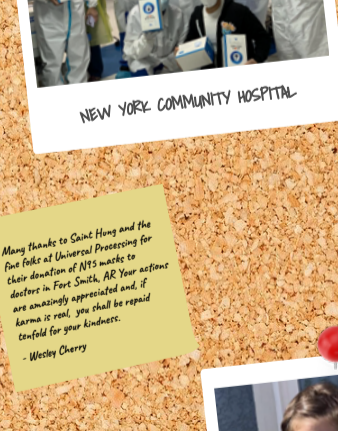


Apr. 15, 2020
